

Morning & Evening Prayer

THE CHURCH'S daily diet of prayer is the Divine Office. In the religious houses, the full cycle usually includes seven times of prayer by day and one by night. Adapted for clergy and lay people, this pattern of seven 'hours' of the day and one of the night— 'or offices' —is somewhat simplified. We end up with three day offices ('Morning Prayer' [or 'Lauds'], 'Prayer During the Day' [or 'Midday' Prayer], and 'Evening Prayer' [or 'Vespers']), one night office, 'Night Prayer' [or 'Compline'], and one longer study office, the 'Office of Readings' [the monastics call it 'Vigils' or 'Matins'] at a time to suit personal convenience.

All of this is canonically binding on the clergy but lay people are invited to join in, in whole or in part, as best suits them. Some people use 'Morning & Evening Prayer', to join in what are called the cardinal, or 'hinge' offices. Others use simpler forms of these, as found in, say, the magazine *Magnificat* or basic prayer books. Some simply join in the spirit of the daily round by marking the day with the saying of the *Angelus*, at morning, at midday, and in the evening. Some say the Lord's Prayer in a similar fashion.

The Rosary was designed in the Middle Ages to help everyone to pray. By taking care of the words, and the fingers, the mind and heart could focus on God and the Divine Mysteries. This was a kind of Psalter, especially suitable for those who cannot read. The full Rosary was originally 150 *Aves*, each set accompanied by *Pater Noster* and *Gloria Patri*, and this matched the Psalter used in the monasteries and by the clergy, where there were 150 psalms to say. The Rosary was adapted by Pope St John Paul II and the Mysteries of Light give us another 50 *Aves*, which enrich the exercise but somewhat disguise the origin of the Rosary as a Lay Psalter.

There are a few Office books at the back of Church, as well as a Bible or two. The volumes of 'Morning & Evening Prayer' are the version currently used by the Catholic Church in this part of the world. The slimmer volumes are the Four-Week Psalter, as produced for Africa, and using the Revised Grail Psalter, to which we are all gradually moving. Plenty of opportunities, therefore, for prayerful consideration and enrichment of the daily pattern of prayer in which we are all called to share.
